UNDERGRADUATE COMMENCEMENT *Commencement Speaker*



CALVIN L. TROUP '83, PhD is the twentieth president of Geneva College, chosen by the Board of Trustees in 2016.

Dr. Troup worked as a trend analyst for The Naisbitt Group (owned by John Naisbitt, author of *Megatrends*), congressional staff aide to Rep. Duncan Hunter, and an executive for the National Association of Life Underwriters in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Troup returned to academia, earning a master's degree (1991) and a doctorate (1994) in Speech Communication from the Pennsylvania State University. He served on the faculties of Penn State, University Park, and Indiana University, Bloomington. He moved to the Department of Communication & Rhetorical Studies at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, where he directed the university's nationally ranked Rhetoric doctoral program.

Since returning to the Pittsburgh area, Dr. Troup has served on the Geneva College Board of Corporators and Board of Trustees, leading several college and board committees.

The "Life G" Award Recipients

The "Life G" Award, Geneva's highest alumni honor, is presented each year to a graduate for service above self, one who embodies the principles for which Geneva College stands and whose efforts on behalf of the College, the community and the nation have been exemplary.



DR. KENNETH E. HARTMAN is a 1963 graduate of Geneva College with a BS in Chemistry. Ken went on to earn his Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry from the University of Pennsylvania in 1968. Soon after, he returned to Geneva as a chemistry professor 1968-2005, serving as department chair for nine years and director of Pre-Med Allied Health. He coached Geneva soccer from 1970-1974 and was inducted into the Geneva College Sports Hall of Fame in 2019. Ken earned Geneva's Excellence in Teaching Award in 1995 and the Distinguished Service Award in 2003.

Ken was a board member and soccer coach at Beaver County Christian School and served as a volunteer with the Beaver Falls Fire Department. He is a Pennsylvania Master Gardener and was a deacon at College Hill Reformed Presbyterian Church, currently holding membership at Chapel PCA Church in Beaver.

Ken is the Founder and President of Nursing ABC/Portage Learning where he has served from 2005-present. Portage Learning offers online college classes through Geneva College to students across the nation.

Ken and wife, Dee, live in Beaver Falls and have two adult children, Nathan (Kara) and Lisbeth (Stephen), and enjoy spending time with their grandchildren.



MARY ROBERTA DILL MCFARLAND was born January 17, 1929 in Sterling, KS, and graduated from Sterling College in 1951. She served as a deacon of the Topeka Reformed Presbyterian Church and in the Women's Missionary Fellowship as President of the local, regional and national fellowships. She was active in both the College Hill and Geneva Reformed Presbyterian churches while living in Beaver Falls.

She married Joe McFarland while he was en-route to Korea in December 1951 and began a highly successful 24-year teaching career in Home Economics and Science in Kansas, Indiana, Taiwan and Cyprus. In 1984, she was selected as "Kansas Vocational Home Economics Teacher of the Year." She was First Lady of Geneva College during her husband's tenure as president from 1984-1992.

She earned her M.S. from Emporia State University in 1962 and was honored to receive the "Woman of the Year Award" in 1990 from the Pennsylvania Beaver Valley Jaycees. Roberta considers her highest honors to be the titles of "Mother" (3 children), "Grandmother" (3) and "Great-Grandmother" (2)!

PRIZES AND AWARDS

The **Achievement Award from the Society for Analytical Chemists of Pittsburgh** is made to a junior or senior for excellent performance in the study of chemistry. The student is selected by the chemistry department faculty.

The **AIChE Professional Promise Award** is an annual award presented by the Pittsburgh chapter of The American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) to senior chemical engineers from participating colleges or universities. Each recipient must have an excellent academic record and also have internship or research experience that will support a successful career after graduation.

Barbara A. Henderson Memorial Award. This monetary gift is given to the major in history who has attained the highest average, above 3.4, in history courses in his or her four years.

The **Biblical Theology Prize** is awarded to the student who attains the highest scores and produces the best academic writing in Bible 325.

The **Biomedical Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the senior considered to be the most outstanding student in biomedical engineering, based on grade point average, character, and leadership.

The **Catherine Robertson McCartney Prize** is a monetary gift given in her memory by the Estate of Mrs. John Robertson McCartney for the best work in Biblical Introduction to the New Testament.

The **Charles “Chuck” Wilson Memorial Prize** is offered by the Athletic Director to a graduating senior student athlete from Beaver County.

The **Charles N. O’Data Leadership Prize** is a cash award given to a graduating senior in recognition of his/her example as a servant-leader in academics, student life and Christian ministry. This prize is in honor of Mr. O’Data’s longstanding commitment and faithful service to the vision and mission of Geneva College.

The **Charles Spurgeon “Spud” McCracken 1918 Award** is presented to a graduating senior football student-athlete who most exemplifies the high standards of character, scholarship, leadership and community service for which Spud was committed.

The **Chemical Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in chemical engineering, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Civil Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in civil engineering, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Computer Science Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in computer science, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Communication Disorders Prize**, given by the Hockenberger family, is a cash prize awarded to a senior Communication Disorders major who has demonstrated outstanding academic achievement and commitment to the profession of

Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology who will enroll in a graduate Communication Disorders program in the upcoming academic year.

The **Department of Competer Science and Cybersecurity Outstanding Student Award** is presented to the most outstanding student in computer science, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Dr. David M. Carson Award** is given in honor of Dr. David Carson, who served Geneva College as professor of political science from 1946 to 1992. The award recognizes Dr. Carson’s years of faithful teaching, his role in the establishment of the political science major, and his commitment to excellence, particularly in the area of bringing God’s Word to bear on political questions. The award is given at the discretion of the political science department to one or more outstanding political science majors to help defray the cost of the junior and/or senior year.

The **Dr. Harry Farra Communication Prize** is a cash prize awarded in honor of Dr. Harry Farra, former Chair of the Communication Department, to a senior Communication major who has demonstrated strong character in attaining outstanding academic achievement.

The **Dr. J. Randall Nutter Memorial Award** is presented in honor of Dr. J. Randall Nutter to the graduate student who demonstrates the qualities that, as the founder of the MBA program, Dr. Nutter modeled for and expected of his students—academic superiority, commitment to the reformed faith and obedience to our gracious Savior.

The **Dr. L. Thomas Keim Memorial Award** is given in memory of Dr. L. Thomas Keim to a graduating senior in the business department who has demonstrated integrity, honesty and character in the commitment to a Christian lifestyle.

The **Dr. Lawrence M. and Kathryn I. Douglas Scholarship Award** is awarded (minimum \$200) to a junior education major who exhibits superiority in character, scholarship, leadership, potential as a competent teacher and who through student activities has made worthwhile contribution to the college and the Department of Education.

The **Dr. Philip L. Coon Memorial Scholarship** was initiated by Mr. and Mrs. Harry F. Reid and goes to a student majoring in chemistry and about to enter his or her senior year who is noted for academic record and overall worthiness.

The **Dr. Roy M. Adams Chemistry Prize**, provided from an endowed fund established by Dr. Allen R. Siedle, is given to a third- or fourth-year student who has demonstrated excellence and achievement in undergraduate research in chemistry. Dr. Siedle wishes to honor Dr. Adams for his contributions to education, the teaching of chemistry, and chemical research and to encourage research at Geneva College.

The **Dr. W. E. Cleland Award** is a cash award given by Mary Cleland to the senior mathematics major with the highest credit point average in mathematics for his or her college career. Professor

Cleland was chairman of the Department of Mathematics and served as dean of the faculty.

The **Eleanor Leighty Library Prize** is a cash award given by Mr. Albert J. Miller in memory of Mrs. Eleanor J. Leighty, librarian of Geneva College from 1926 to 1966, to the graduating senior whose outstanding work as a student assistant has enhanced the goals and objectives of the library program.

The **Electrical and Computer Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in electrical or computer engineering, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Environmental Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in environmental engineering, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Excellence in Business Award** is given by the faculty of the Department of Business, Accounting and Management to graduating seniors for “Excellent Academic Performance, Personal Character and Demonstration of Christian Faith.”

The **Geneva College Writing Award** is given to the person who has done excellent writing in a variety of genres.

The **George Tannehill Outstanding Senior Business Award** is the top award given by the faculty of the Department of Business, Accounting and Sport Management to a graduating senior for “Outstanding Academic Performance, Superior Personal Character and Laudable Demonstration of Christian Faith.”

The **Geri D. Bass Award** of \$100 is awarded to a graduating senior who has shown academic excellence, involvement in college activities and service to the local or home community. It is given in honor of Mrs. Bass, associate professor emerita of English.

The **Good Citizenship Award**, a cash prize, certificate and medal, are given by the General Anthony Wayne Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution to the student in the senior class chosen for patriotic, historical and educational contributions to the community.

The **Hartman Chemistry Prize** is given in memory of Teresa and G. Kenneth Hartman, by their son, to the most deserving senior chemistry major who plans to enter graduate study.

The **Hebrew Prize** honors the student who has achieved the highest grades in at least two semesters of Biblical Hebrew.

The **Helen Wallace Bruce Memorial Music Scholarship** is awarded to a junior majoring or interested in music, with preference given to piano or voice specialties. It is given in memory of Helen Wallace Bruce by the family and friends of her late husband, Dr. Harold Bruce, to show their appreciation of the role she played in making music an enjoyable part of the college, the community, her neighborhood and her church.

The **Howard and Hargrave Patterson Award** is a cash award made in memory of Howard, who died while a student at Geneva in 1922, and his brother, Hargrave, who graduated in 1924. The award goes to one or more members of the graduating class who have clearly articulated the doctrines and practices of Christian government, with particular regard to the kingship of Christ in the political process.

The **Howard Mattsson-Bozé Prize for Sociology** is awarded annually in honor of Professor Emeritus Howard Mattsson-Bozé to the graduating senior sociology major who has best embodied a commitment to excellence in scholarship and compassionate care for others in the spirit of Christ.

The **Human Service Scholastic Excellence Award** is presented to the graduating human service major who has demonstrated academic excellence and a strong commitment to high ideals in the field of human services.

The **Iva E. Patterson Music Award** is presented for outstanding achievement in the field of music and is available to students in their junior and senior years, without regard to race, color, creed, sex or national origin. The scholarship is interest from a trust fund established by the late Paul H. Gilmore. Selection of the recipient is made by the faculty of the music department.

The **Jack Pinkerton Engineering Design Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the student achieving the most outstanding performance on the capstone design project, exhibited by innovation, discovery, research, initiative, leadership, teamwork, persistence, hard work and outstanding results.

The **Jessica Vojnovich Demarco Commencement Prize** is presented to the most deserving graduating senior who is a member of Geneva College's softball team and demonstrates exceptional leadership, character, and discipline. The prize was established in Jessica's memory and acknowledges her contribution as an accomplished softball player, her dedication to academic excellence, and her love of family and friends. Jessica, #24, was a 2006 graduate of Geneva with degrees in Chemical Engineering and Chemistry.

The **John Mandeville Business And Commerce Award** is presented to the graduate in the department who best demonstrates in their understanding of business and commerce the application of Reformed Christian principles including the value of the individual and honesty.

The **Jonathan Antonishen "Anto" Commencement Award** is presented in memory of Jonathan Antonishen, is presented to the senior football player who shows compassion and kindness, strong leadership qualities, a striving for personal achievement, dedication to the well-being of others, and demonstration of team loyalty and work ethic both on and off the field.

The **Kathleen Riethmuller McIntyre Scholarship Fund** is awarded to a junior elementary education major who has achieved academic excellence. Mrs. McIntyre, a 1973 graduate of Geneva College, says to the recipient: "I hope that this scholarship, your training at Geneva College, and your own special gifts and talents will lead you to grow as a teacher and a leader who continually strives for 'Excellence in Education.'"

The **Larry and Margaret Blinn Memorial Award**, made from the income on a trust fund given in memory of Larry and Margaret Blinn by her brother, Dr. Ray McQueen '31, is presented to the graduating senior who has done the best work in the field of American history.

The **Leotta C. Hawthorne Reading Award** is given annually by the members of the Geneva College Department of Education to an elementary education major who has had outstanding achievement in reading and who has made a major contribution to the college reading program in the Department of Education.

The **Linda Bailey Education Award** is given in memory of Mrs. Linda Bailey, friend of many and secretary for the education department from 1986 to 2001, to a senior education major who excels as a student teacher and models an attitude of servanthood.

Mabel Davison Weagly Award. The interest on a \$2000 trust fund is to be given to the student who showed the greatest progress in the music department in the second semester of the academic year.

The **Mechanical Engineering Award** is presented by the Department of Engineering to the most outstanding student in mechanical engineering, based on grade point average, character and leadership.

The **Metheny Medical Prize** is given to the graduating pre-med student with the highest academic average. The prize is given in memory of C. Brainerd Metheny and David B. Metheny by Mr. & Mrs. Richard T. Metheny.

The **Outstanding Senior Psychology Student Award**, sponsored by the Christian Association for Psychological Studies (CAPS), is presented to a senior student who meets three criteria: 1) must demonstrate exceptional interest and pursuit of excellence in academic studies; 2) must demonstrate extension of self in service to others beyond the classroom; and 3) must evidence Christian commitment and personal growth in his/her approach to professional interests and life in general.

The **P.I.C.P.A. Accounting Prize** is given to a senior majoring in accounting "having a superior grade point average, with character and leadership considered."

The **Paul E. Smith Senior English Prize** is a monetary gift of \$250 awarded by the English department of Geneva College for the best work in senior English.

The **Paul H. Gilmore Humanities Award** is a scholarship, provided by a trust fund established by the late Paul H. Gilmore, given to the student who has done the most outstanding work in the humanities program, without regard to race, color, creed, sex or national origin. Selection of the recipient is made by the faculty of the humanities program.

The **Professor A.C. Edgcombe Award** is presented by the Faculty and Staff of the Department of Engineering, to the graduating engineering student who is thought most likely to succeed in business.

The **Rudolph and Mildred Polovina Schwartz Memorial Scholarship** is awarded to a junior elementary education major who exhibits academic responsibility, moral character, scholarship and leadership potential as a competent teacher and who through student activities has made a worthwhile contribution to the college and the Department of Education.

The **Senior Speech Prize** is a cash prize is awarded each year by the Estate of Dr. W. Clair and Melba Brown Merriman to the senior speech major who has demonstrated outstanding academic achievement.

The **Student-Athlete Award** is a \$100 cash award presented annually by the Estate of Dr. W. Clair and Melba Brown Merriman to the graduating senior athlete with the highest academic average.

The **Sylvester Amon Engineering Award** is a scholarship given to the junior engineering student from Beaver County with the highest average by the Beaver County Chapter, Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers.

The **Valedictorian and Robert Park Excellence Prize** is the interest on a trust fund given by Dr. S. C. Milligan of Pittsburgh in memory of his father, the Rev. J.S.T. Milligan, D.D., who was a member of the first graduating class in 1852.

The **Virginia Davis Napoli Award** is presented to a graduating senior woman athlete who most exemplifies the high standards of character, scholarship and leadership to which Virginia was committed.

The **Walkinshaw Music Prize** is given in memory of the late Mr. and Mrs. William J. Walkinshaw for superior achievements in vocal or string performance or in music history and theory.

The **William Columbus Award** is provided by a trust fund established by the late Mr. William Columbus and given to the student maintaining the best average in the study of Greek.

The **William M. Ewing Mathematics Education Award**, donated by his students, is given to the senior majoring in mathematics education with the highest credit point average overall. Mr. Ewing was a mathematics professor at Geneva and retired in 1992.

CALVIN L. TROUP ‘83, PhD is the twentieth president of Geneva College, chosen by the Board of Trustees in 2016.

Dr. Troup worked as a trend analyst for The Naisbitt Group (owned by John Naisbitt, author of *Megatrends*), congressional staff aide to Rep. Duncan Hunter, and an executive for the National Association of Life Underwriters in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Troup returned to academia, earning a master’s degree (1991) and a Ph.D. (1994) in Speech Communication from the Pennsylvania State University. He served on the faculties of Penn State, University Park, and Indiana University, Bloomington. He moved to the Department of Communication & Rhetorical Studies at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, where he directed the university’s nationally ranked Rhetoric Ph.D. program.

Since returning to the Pittsburgh area, Dr. Troup has served on the Geneva College Board of Corporators and Board of Trustees, leading several college and board committees.

The modern academic procession reflects traditions inherited from medieval universities, where a member of the teaching guild was a master of arts and a bachelor was his apprentice. Robes and hoods served to protect scholars from the cold and drafty rooms. As a token of privilege, the master wore a warmer, more distinguished costume than the bachelor.

While no longer everyday apparel, this attire is worn for academic ceremonies to symbolize the world of scholarship. At commencement, new bachelors are received into the community of scholars, taking their place in the traditions of academic life.

The Cap: The familiar “mortarboard” is made of black cloth with a tassel the color of the wearer’s discipline. Doctors in all fields may wear a tassel of metallic gold.

The Gown: The cut of the gown indicates the wearer’s degree. A bachelor wears a simple gown with pointed sleeves; a master’s gown is long, closed sleeves with a slit at the arm or wrist; and a doctor wears a very full gown with bell-shaped sleeves. In addition, the doctor’s gown has velvet panels on the front and three velvet bars on each sleeve, which may be black or the color of a discipline.

The Hood: The color of the velvet border signifies the discipline, while the color of the interior lining identifies the institution. The hood of a bachelor is three feet long; a master’s is three and one-half feet; and a doctor’s is four feet.

Philanthropic Cord: Graduates with an old gold and white cord have demonstrated a commitment to philanthropy and the legacy of Geneva College by donating to the Senior Class Gift.
